The school board has officially adopted the campaign name of Cultivating New Roots to raise money for the project. This name was chosen because it goes along with our slogan, Rooted in Christ, that appears with our new logo. They also wanted to make sure people understand that this building expansion will help prepare our students to live out our mission to live a "life of Christian discipleship, responsible stewardship, and humble service in His Hull Christian School Kingdom." From the Counselors Corner

Boosting Your Child's Confidence

Many kids (adults too) will struggle with confidence and self-esteem at some point in their lives. When a classmate says something unkind, when a test score isn't as high as expected, or when the desired position is already filled on the team, confidence can take a nosedive. It can be helpful for parents to have some confidence boosters ready, or even add some daily habits that can promote healthy self-esteem. Here are some strategies you might consider:

Set a culture of confidence

- Give your child opportunities to learn and try new things
- •Help your child set goals and work with them to accomplish their goals a little struggling to reach a goal builds capability and competence
- •Give your child age-appropriate responsibilities contributing to the household builds confidence
- Model positive self-esteem turn your mistakes into opportunities to learn Avoid comparing your child to peers and/or siblings helps you appreciate your child for who he/she is and builds up their individual aifts
- Encourage your child to pursue their interests

Address failure and struggles

- •Let your child know that you are there if they need help, but encourage them to do as much as possible on their own avoid the urge to swoop in and fix things, which sends the message that you don't think they are capable of doing it on their own
- Praise your child for their effort, not the outcome when we praise only the outcome, we send a message that the child has only done a good job if they succeeded
- Talk to your child about how they can learn from their mistakes and failures pushing through struggles teaches them that they are capable of doing hard things
- •Remind your child that their mistakes and failures do not define them
- Talk with your child about challenges they have overcome in the past

Adopt these daily practices

- •Share one reason that you are thankful for your child
- •Encourage your child to begin each day with a positive mindset they were created on purpose, with purpose, and for a purpose
- Ask your child to share one thing from the day that he/she is proud of helps a child think of their own strengths and abilities

As a Christian, I have struggled sometimes with the term self-esteem, thinking it might be too personcentered and therefore not a "Christlike" concept, but I have read numerous Bible passages that speak of fear, confidence, the gifts we have been given, and living in courage as children of God. Each of our children has been given a gift to use (1 Peter 4:10), and I think it is up to us, as parents, to build some practices that help nurture who they were created to be.


4th - 8th Grade Christmas Caroling
