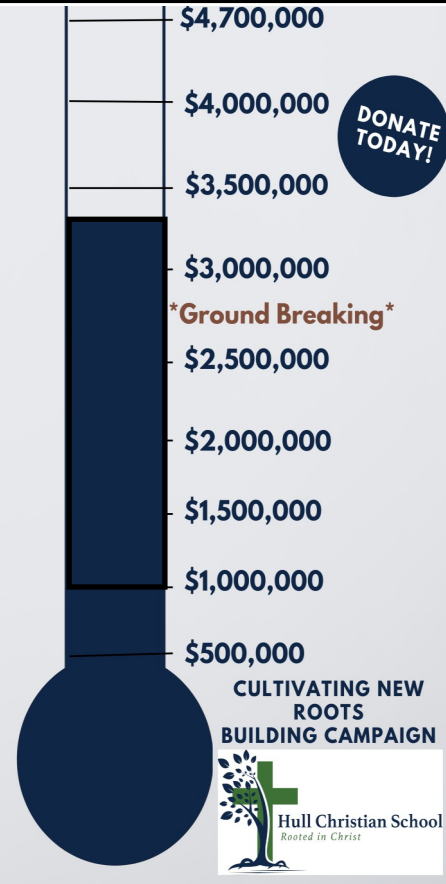

Information Needed for the 2026-2027 School Year

- All students entering 7th grade must have the Meningococcal vaccine and a Tdap booster **before the first day of school**. They cannot start school without those vaccines.
 - * Call your healthcare provider to ask if your child still needs to get these vaccines
 - * A great time to get these vaccines is when kids go in for wellness and sports physicals in the summer.
 - * To be valid for school, the meningococcal vaccine and Tdap booster must be given after the age of 10.
 - * Bring an updated Iowa Certificate of Immunization from your provider to school or have the clinic fax it to school at 888-990-0581.
- Students entering 7th and 8th grades (26-27) who plan on participating in sports are required to have an Athletic Physical. Forms are located on the HCS website.
- If your child has gotten any immunizations in the past year, please get an updated immunization form to the office by September 1, 2026. Our audit is early September.
- Any student with a dietary need/restrictions MUST have a doctor's note and they need to visit with Mr. Ten Pas or Mindy Baccam before the first day of school.
- In order for a student to use a fidget at school, it must be included in the student's 504 Plan or supported by documentation from a physician or licensed counselor. The documentation should be brought to the office.
- If you have any questions, please contact Mr. Ten Pas.
- Looking forward to seeing you in this coming school year. The start date is August 24, 2026.
