The last need being highlighted is space for several after school programs. There are many activities after school that would run more effectively if they had designated spaces. Two of these student programs are K3Care and Beyond the Bell. K3Care is a program that is offered to kindergarten through 3rd grade students on Wednesdays so they can ride the buses home. This group of students currently meets either in the aym, in the music room or even in the airlock (the hallway by the aym). With a building expansion as well as finding more employees to run the program, there is a possibility we could expand this program to more students and more days for after school care. Beyond the Bell is a program that is offered three days after school to 4th- 8^{th} grade students. These students are able to use this time to catch up on homework, study for test or receive assistance for their studies. They are currently sharing a classroom space which is not ideal for the students or the teacher for whose homeroom it is in. The teachers engage in professional development each week. It currently meets in the Discovery Room, a room designed for science and art, but is now a homeroom classroom for the 7th grade. This does not allow time for individuals or organizations who are leading the professional development to prepare and it also interferes in the
