Looking Towards the Future

Do newly built homes have the same floor plans as houses built 25 years ago? Do farmers use the same machinery they used 25 years ago? Do families have the same size TV they watched 25 years ago? In most of these cases, the answer is no. These questions need to be addressed in education as well. Why do things have to change? You may be someone who had 25 classmates in a room similar in size to many of the rooms at HCS. However, the fact remains, education has changed. Chalk and markers have been replaced with chrome books and smart display boards. All students receiving the same instruction has been replaced with differentiated teaching strategies. Students listening to the teacher lecture and then completing individual homework assignments has been revised to incorporate working together to solve multi-level problems. Just as floor plans, farming and TV's have changed, so has education. We are thankful for these differences and we embrace these changes. Changes are necessary in order to meet the educational needs of our students so that we can continue to fulfill our mission. The needs are classrooms, a designated middle school area, safety for our school, afterschool programing, a cafeteria and a gym to meet the demands of our growing enrollment. These educational needs are being addressed by the ad-hoc committee.

We were excited to receive input from a variety of people in regards to a possible building expansion. A survey was sent out with a possible building plan and the reasoning behind the plan. 125 people answered the survey concerning a vote for additional expansion. The ad-hoc committee and School Board will use that information in creating a plan moving forward. The results were as follows:

28.8% - Just a classroom addition

63.2% - Both classroom and gym addition

8% - None of these options

Please continue to pray for the committee and School Board as they move forward in presenting the Society with a proposal for building expansion.

5th grade - Snack Attack (granola bars, fruit snacks, pretzels etc.)


