Mr. Ten Pas Kayaks the Rock and Sioux Rivers

The summer floods of 2024 will be recorded in history and will live in the memories of all of us for years to come. The destruction brought about by the raging water of the Rock and Sioux Rivers left the lives of so many in our neighboring communities turned sideways and upside down. Not only were homes and businesses affected by the flood waters, but also Rock Valley Christian School sustained extreme amounts of damage from the muck and mud that the waters forced through its hallways.

On a summer kayaking trip Mr. Ten Pas took many weeks after the flood waters receded, he took notice of all the debris that remained. He couldn't help feeling a sense of compassion for his fellow educator, Mr. Marcus De Jager, the principal of Rock Valley Christian School. That's when the idea came for him to try to bring about something positive from the flowing river water. He would take part in a Kayak Challenge as his annual Rally Day Sale Principal's Challenge. Little did he know that this idea would bring such a great amount of support and bring such blessing for both schools.

Mr. and Mrs. Ten Pas read the presentation they had prepared to introduce the Kayak challenge. They invited Mr. De Jager to come and give an update on the progress being made at Rock Valley Christian School. The HCS School Board had already approved the idea to share equally the donations that were brought in by the Kayak Challenge between both schools. What occurred next was nothing less than an overwhelming display of generosity and blessing!

The auctioneer opened up the bidding by asking if anyone was willing to give a \$500 donation to send Mr. Ten Pas down the river. Number after number went up as those in attendance rallied around this idea. With those bids alone, Mr. Ten Pas reached the goal he had set to raise \$8,000! Yet, the generosity continued; \$250 bids came in and then \$100 bids until all the numbers were written down and the tallying began. The grand total for the Kayak Challenge was just shy of \$20,000! It was truly amazing and a testament to the goodness and faithfulness of our God!

Three days later the fulfillment of the challenge began. On Tuesday September 24, Mr. Ten Pas put the kayak in the waters of the Rock River just before 7 AM in Rock Rapids. Making it through Doon and into Rock Valley before dark, he set up his tent on the sandy shore line just north of Highway 18. Refreshed by a good night's sleep, he was paddling again by 7:15 AM on Wednesday and heading for Oak Grove State Park. He was thankful to be given a camp site and a warm shower there and set off on Thursday morning on the last leg of the journey. He spent the entire last day on the Sioux River heading toward his final destination of Akron, Iowa, making it there at 5:00 PM on Thursday evening.

Were his muscles sore? Not as sore as he thought they would be. Was his body tired? Yes. Was he ready to be out of the kayak? Yes! But even though all those things were true, he still felt an overwhelming sense of knowledge that he was so blessed and supported. He knew he had been sustained by all the

thoughts and prayers that were with him. He knew that God had taken his small idea and turned it into something much bigger than he ever imagined. But then again, that's what our God does!
