Hull Christian School's Long-Term Goals

Managing the Challenges with Enrollment

Starting November 2026 and continuing each year, the education committee will conduct a comprehensive analysis from teachers regarding the instructional needs to manage continued enrollment and growth; identifying recommendations for additional needs or resources.

Long Term Financial Planning: Finance Committee & Building Committee

By November 2029, the Finance and Building Committee will develop and present a comprehensive capital improvement plan that includes a full facilities assessment, prioritized project list, cost estimates, and funding strategies to support HCS long-term infrastructure needs.

Protect and Sustain Christian Education at HCS

By June of 2028, the board will partner with teachers to develop a plan to include language for educational structure, pedagogical direction aiming to keep HCS consistently aligned with its mission and faith statement.

Addressing Student Conduct

By February 2027, the principal will establish a team made up of teachers/staff, designated parents, and student leaders, will develop an actionable plan for implementing and monitoring student respect and behavior, gaining feedback from parents on shared values and outcomes. They will share the results with the education committee

Curriculum Strength

Each May, beginning in 2027, the advisory committee will utilize feedback from HCS alumni and provide 3 recommendations to the education committee for adjustments to make in curriculum, teaching, or programming.
